Due to increasing reports of altercations between anglers, conflicts between anglers and boaters, and resource violations, Sebastian Inlet's North Jetty will be closed from sunset to sunrise for a temporary period beginning Friday, October 7, 2016.

Agencies (Sebastian Inlet District, Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission, Brevard County Sheriff's Office and the Sebastian Inlet State Park) are currently working together to identify enforceable Jetty rules and monitoring that will ensure a safe, family-friendly environment.

The Sebastian Inlet was constructed by the Sebastian Inlet District in the early 1900's for navigation between the Indian River and the Atlantic Ocean. Rock jetties built in the 1920's were improved and extended in the 1950's as navigation devices. Fishing from the jetty has been allowed for decades. However, as a navigation structure, the primary purpose of the North Jetty is to provide a safe, navigable inlet.

The desire of the Sebastian Inlet Commission is to quickly identify measures that eliminate the existing conflicts and promote a safe environment for all users of the inlet and jetties.
